"But no session shall exceed the term of sixty days."

The foregoing amendment shall be submitted to the electors of this State at an election to be held on the first Amendment to be Tuesday after the first Monday of November, to wit: on the submitted to elecsixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and tors sixty, in the several election districts of this State, the ballots at said election shall be as follows:

"Those in favor of this amendment limiting legislativo sessions, 'yes;' those against the amendment limiting legislative sessions, 'no.'" The polls at said election shall open and election hav can close at the same hour, and be conducted in the same manner, ducted and the same notice shall be given of this election as is or may be directed by law for electing State officers, and the returns thereof shall be made and certified in the manner provided by law for returning votes for said officers, and such returns shall be canvassed by the official Board of Convassers of the State within forty days after said election, and if it shall appear that a majority of voters present and voting at said election have ratified the proposed amendment, the Governor shall make proclamation thereof and incorporate the foregoing amendment in the Constitution, and deposit the said election returns in the office of the Secretary of State.
